
Minister's Letter

Letter from the Programme Manager March 2009

This comes to wish you happy celebration for Easter and to thank you for all the assistance you have given to Timothy. As you may be aware all our children are vulnerable but with the help extended to us the children are in school and are really promising to perform well. I want to thank you for the commitment of educating these children; this is one of the ways of alleviating poverty in Uganda and Africa as a whole. These children are trained to become self employed in the last two years on our programme and the training they get can help in the development of the communities where they come from.

Today Uganda is gradually moving away from a predominantly agricultural economy towards one emphasising services and manufacturing. With this trend we hope our children will be absorbed in some of these upcoming sectors.

Most of the children we work with are from HIV/AIDS affected families. HIV is a major public and development issue. It has affected households in



all parts of the country. With the help of the government and various non-governmental organisations, there has been a steady decline in infection especially in urban areas.

I want to thank you for playing a big role in these children's lives and to wish you a happy Easter season.

He was stunned with disbelief, grief and anger. He cried out, 'God! How could you do this to me?' Early the next day, he was awakened by the sound of a ship approaching the island! It had come to rescue him! 'How did you know I was here?' asked the weary man of his rescuers. 'We saw your smoke signal,' they replied.

The Moral of this story:

It's easy to get discouraged when things are going badly, but we shouldn't lose heart, because God is at work in our lives, even in the midst of our pain and suffering. Remember that, the next time your little hut seems to be burning to the ground. It just may be a smoke signal that summons the Grace of God.
