# Minister's Letter

Dear Friends,

On 1 November 2003 the Methodist Church and the Church of England entered into a Covenant commitment after many years of conversations about church unity. The presence of the Queen at the official signing of the

Covenant gave special significance to the occasion and the ceremony was followed by a service of thanksgiving and dedication at Westminster Abbey.

On 11 February 2010 the President and Vice-President of the Methodist



Conference were invited to address the General Synod of the Church of England and their words were reported in the secular press, not always accurately! To some they seemed to be saying that Methodism was finished. It is worth quoting therefore exactly what they did say: "We are prepared to go out of existence not because we are declining or failing in mission, but for the sake of mission. In other words we are

prepared to be changed and even to cease to have a separate existence as a Church if that will serve the needs of the Kingdom".

Subsequently a "Pastoral Address" has been sent out, copies of which are available at the back of church. I hope folk will read this carefully, and do so bearing in mind that we are in the season of Lent preparing for Easter. Easter speaks of "death" and "resurrection" and for the Christian these two cannot be separated. They are two sides of the same coin. You cannot understand Good Friday (death) without Easter Sunday (resurrection), and vice versa. You cannot have new life in the church without letting go of some of the old.

Our own lives too are full of "deaths" and "resurrections", some fairly minor, others major. They are a fundamental part of God's creation and his ongoing

creative activity. In all things we seek the loving, guiding and protecting hand of God through the work of his Holy Spirit.

For a thoroughly enjoyable evening you can't do much better than seeing Oakworth's annual panto. Audience and performers come together in an uproarious way that many other local pantos would kill for. I saw this year's show only a couple of nights into the run but the cast were so hyper you'd think it was their final night.

The first act fair bustled along, but it act that truly was the second impressed with a succession of terrific set pieces. An opening ballroom dance, Happy Little Ogres, You're The One That I Want, an underwater ultraviolet scene, a Can-Can with kitchen utensils. All set against brilliant scenery that included a castle tower, a bridge, a working fountain and a brightly-burning stove. There were great duets, cracking chorus numbers and -- like last year -- one of the bestsung panto finales you'll hear across the district.

Only one niggle: across the cast much of the dialogue sounded as if it was being read rather than acted. But

all these performers were so loud, clear, and enthusiastic that we could forgive a little stiffness and mis-timing of jokes.

The successful Autumn events were reported in the last Newsletter and special monthly Jubilee Services have continued through the winter.






