Congratulations



News Snippets

Ellis Wright

Harvest Gifts

"The Salvation Army in Keighley would like to thank you for the kind donation of food which we received from your Harvest. The support of your congregation Is most welcome and very much appreciated. All donations, whether food or money, are used for the hot meals we serve to those who are displaced, individuals suffering because of family breakdown, adults probation newly released on referrals from social services, family centres and the community Drug and Alcohol team. Cereals, long life milk, biscuits, tins of rice pudding and baked beans are most useful for providing food parcels. These are given out on a daily basis, at the request of Social Services and other professional and voluntary agencies, to people in need. This is an ongoing project throughout the year, gifts of food and donations of cash are always needed. Thank you for enabling the Salvation Army to carry out this important ministry to the people of Keighley and Craven."

Choir Concert

The Airedale Male Voice Choir provided us with a wonderful evening's entertainment last month when they came to help raise funds for the Ladies' Group's chosen charities this year. The church was full and the singing was much enjoyed by all. A big thank you to all who helped raise £460 that night.

Treasurer's Report

We give thanks once again for the healthy set of figures shown above! We are grateful to you all for your continued support.

Receipts

Collections were about the same as the previous year but the amount of **Tax recovered** on Gift Aided collections and donations was down by £400, reflecting the lower level of one-off donations.

However, with three new groups using our premises regularly, income from **Property/Lettings** shows a very healthy £650 increase.

Fundraising income was down by £200 and **Investment income** hit rock bottom with poor economic conditions continuing to prevail.

But it was our Golden Jubilee Year and the Donations/Gift Appeals figure includes £1,500 raised by the Jubilee Appeal, towards the Jubilee expenses.

We were very pleased with your response to other **Mission** appeals and collections, as were the charities!

Payments

We were able to increase our **Circuit Share** by £650 as promised.

Property Maintenance costs went up £1,500, back to the level of two years ago. **Sundry Payments** also increased by £700. A significant factor in both these figures was the higher cost of copying and printing.

Cleaner's Wages and Utility costs increased with inflation but Sunday School costs were level.

The **Project work**, which was all financed independently of the general funds, included the new audio-visual equipment and "flight desk" and the improvements in the hall.

Summary

Whilst general expenses increased by almost £3,000 and some income streams actually reduced, we were still able to end the year with a small surplus thanks to the fact that none of last year's project costs

were funded from general income. Thanks again for your continuing support.


