Pastoral Letter

Dear Friends.

If you were asked about some of Jesus' last words to his followers, I wonder which ones you'd come up with. Perhaps you'd remember, 'Lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the world/age.' Or perhaps it would be, 'Go and make disciples of all nations.' But if you were thinking of John's gospel, it might be, 'Peace to you'.

Each of these sayings is important but they do

give a slightly different emphasis. When, in the fourth gospel, Jesus constantly greets his amazed and frightened disciples after the resurrection with the words, 'Peace to you', he is reminding them of, and offering them anew, 'the peace which the world cannot give.' It is an inner peace which flows from his presence. Jesus comes to his disciples and gives himself to them, revealing his forgiving love for each one.

He does not criticise.

He does not make any recriminations.

He does not judge them or remind them of how badly they let him down.

He does not speak of betrayal.

He does not make anyone feel guilty. Instead, Jesus confirms his choice of them.

They are his beloved ones, and he is there for each of them.

When we too have failed him and are locked behind doors of fear and shame, Jesus comes to us and says,

'Peace to you.'

In all the pain and joy of the journey of life, Jesus meets us with unfailing love and forgiveness. This is at the root of the peace he gives – and this is what he wishes us to model in our lives, that others may be drawn to him.

Dear friends,

You will be aware that I have been here for nearly 4 years, so a consultation would usually happen about now to determine whether I should stay beyond the initial 5 year appointment or move on.

However, I shall be 65 by the end of next summer, so I intend to seek permission to retire. Be assured that I am not in the process of 'winding down' yet, and will be fully with you until July 2016.



MISSIAN POSSIBLE

We were challenged a few years ago to review our Church's Mission:

- · What could we do better?
- What new initiatives would enable us to spread the good news of Jesus in our community?

The whole process has seemed a bit like "Mission Impossible" but a fresh approach - "Mission Possible" - has resulted in a more positive response.

Messy Church was just one new initiative to come out of the initial process and, whilst attendance varies, between 10 and 30 additional children and parents are actively engaging with the Gospel every month as a result.

Our Church Strategy Team looked at four strengths of our church:

- The variety in our forms of worship
- · Involvement in community life
- Our work with young people mostly not on a Sunday!
- The emphasis placed on drama from pantomimes to drama in worship

Mission opportunities have come and gone over the years in our work with young people. Most recently, Louise and Lizzie successfully led the 'Crossing the Bridge' Youth Group. That particular group has now run its course and Louise has moved into training for full time Ministry. We need to focus on developing a new form of Mission amongst our young people.

- · Who might lead it?
- What might it look like?

We would love to see more use of drama in worship and to put on other forms of drama - using all age groups.

Could drama be the hook to help us talk about faith matters together? We struggle to run fellowship groups at Oakworth - this could be an answer.

· Who might help us with this?

Church Council put much thought and prayer into these questions. This resulted in a new Mission Statement and a fresh approach to our Strategy for the Future - under the banner:



proved too expensive. They still offer a much improved building layout with everything under one roof:

- New Front Entrance faces main road making us more visible
- Up to five meeting spaces could be used at same time
- Extra toilet facilities at other side of building
- Playgroup area self-contained and secure – so other areas of building can be used whilst they are in

- Playgroup facilities much improved enabling them to meet Ofsted requirements
- Much needed storage space available to church and all user groups
- Improvements to stage layout / access would bring several benefits
- Fire Risk / Health & Safety requirements would be met – legal obligation
- Reduced carbon footprint and costs with Solar PV and LED lights

The plan and graphics in this leaflet will help you to to see how the improved layout will work.





Church Council put together a two-part package to address our Mission needs, bring practical benefits to the Church and enable us to meet our legal and community obligations. This was unanimously agreed subject to gaining sufficient church/community support:

- 1. Employ a part time Youth & Community worker with drama skills
 - To capitalise on Mission opportunities in existing and new groups of young people
 - To encourage the use of drama in worship and as a tool for Mission
 - Could it be a Circuit appointment with say 10 hours per week at Oakworth and other churches utilising hours to make it a half time or full time post?
- 2. Embark on a scaled-down version of the previous building plans
 - To make the church more visible and welcoming and reduce our carbon footprint
 - To improve the building layout and storage with everything under one roof
 - To meet Ofsted requirements for Playgroup and legal Health & Safety obligations

The total cost of these proposals will be around £248,000. We already have £55,000 towards this in bequests and donations and would hope to raise a further £115,000 (50% of building costs) from charitable grants and trusts. We are hoping for £53,000 from Circuit and District grants, leaving us £25,000 to raise from donations and fundraising.

Whilst we do not expect raising all this money to be an easy ride, we do believe it is perfectly do-able. We also believe that using the funds we have been given so far as a catalyst to attract further grants makes financial sense.

This is one of the most positive projects this church has ever embarked upon and we are delighted that both church and community have got behind it by voting unanimously in favour - with over 110 votes cast as we go to print. If you haven't yet shown your support, please do so at the back of church as soon as possible - voting closes on 14th June in time to advise Circuit Meeting.






