Pastoral Letter

Dear Friends.

Most of us probably have memories of nativity plays. We think of angels looking so sweet and innocent, we can hardly believe they are the children we know. We remember a Mary who clutched the baby Jesus and almost tossed him in the manger. Or perhaps we think of a Joseph who held Mary's hand so tenderly. I'm sure many



of us have shed a tear as we've watched children we thought we knew become engrossed and transformed (if but temporarily) in the telling of the story.

Nativity plays are, of course, very selective in which parts of the story they re-tell. Mary's disgrace, humiliation even; Joseph's horror at the news of the baby which isn't his; the difficulties of the long journey to Bethlehem on foot; (no, there isn't a donkey in the Gospel story!) are all left out. As for the Magi, who stir up a political hornet's nest, they are changed into harmless 'Wise men' unconnected to the terrible slaughter of the baby boys in Bethlehem.

Yet there is something very wonderful about watching children in a nativity play which evokes for us again the joy and wonder of the God-child in a manger. It's some time since we had a nativity play here, but this year we are anticipating some of our young people leading our Christmas worship through drama and song.* Perhaps we need this annual reminder so that we too, may bend very low in order to worship the Word-made-flesh.

Blessed art thou,
O Christmas Christ,
that thy cradle was so low
that shepherds,
poorest and simplest of earthly folk,
could yet kneel beside it,
and look level-eyed into the face of God.

Treasurer's Report

We continue to give thanks for the commitment and support of so many people which enables the Mission work of our church.



Receipts

Collections, Fund Raising and Tax Recoveries were all down on the previous year for various reasons but Property/Lettings were up again, thanks to one or two new regular groups using the hall and an increase in children's parties. Nevertheless, we covered our expenses and we are grateful for this.

Payments

We were able to increase our Circuit Share by £400 as promised.

Utility costs were well down following a long-running battle with our electricity providers to sort out a problem with the meter readings.

All other general costs were broadly in line with the budgeted figures.

Project Costs

These covered the cost of Singing the Faith hymn books, decorating the toilets & corridor, new LED lights and further upgrading the sound system.

They were fully covered by the Project Income which is kept separate from the normal budget.

Summary

General Reserves at the year-end were about the same as last year - just under the three months expenditure figure agreed by Church Council.

Total Reserves were, of course, much higher because they include £104,500 of funds held for the Mission Possible building extension project.

Thanks again to everyone for your generosity which has not only enabled us to balance the books but has also provided a substantial base this year for the Mission Possible Appeal.

We ask for your continuing prayerful support through the current year so that our general expenses continue to be covered as we concentrate our efforts on fundraising for the **Appeal**.







We had a brilliant Launch Event on 3rd October - with good representation from church, community groups and others who called in to encourage us. The lan Dewhirst Evening, Tea at the Ritz, Singalong Evening, Rainbow/Brownie/Guide Open Evening and 3 Film Nights were also well supported and enjoyed by all. A Mission Possible Pantomime Parents Group is also organising various fundraising initiatives to swell the coffers.

In just two months - donations, promises & gift aid have raised a staggering £20,200 for the church/community fundraising appeal (target £33,500) - bringing the total amount raised/promised to date for the whole project to £143,850 (total cost £260,000).
