### **Pantomime News**





# **Oakworth Methodist Church**

£27,772 has been raised so far from donations, promises and gift aid for the church/community fundraising appeal (target £33,500) - bringing the total amount raised/promised to date for the whole project to £155,600 (total cost £260,000). Details and photos of the latest successful events can be found inside this Newsletter.

We are delighted to report the receipt of our first charitable trust grant at the end of May - £3,450 from the Allchurches Trust.

Other grant applications are at various stages in the application cycle and we look forward to the next successful one.

Building Regulations Approval for our Building Extension came through last month and the Architect is now drawing up the detailed plans ready to go out to tender. We are now very hopeful that the building work can start next Easter.
