Pastoral Letter

Dear friends

When I was a child, I used to love setting up our Christmas crib scene. We'd carefully unwrap all the figures and put them in place as we thought about the story they told. I still love crib scenes: and the stories they have to tell when you look at them more closely. Some crib scenes have beautiful figures, hand carved from olive wood while the figures in others are wobbly and made of cardboard tubes and tissue paper. Some have figures knitted in brightly



coloured wool and others have figures carefully modelled in clay. There are crib scenes with figures that are larger than life and others with figures so tiny they fit into a walnut shell. There are some figures which no one dare touch for fear of damaging them and others which just invite you to touch them and hold them and bring their stories to life.

The crib scenes are there to tell us the story of the birth of a baby who changed the lives of everyone who came into contact with him. The story speaks to us of a young mother who risked her life and reputation to give birth to this child of God, a down to earth carpenter who dared to follow the advice of an angel, an innkeeper who forgot rules and regulations and made room for a baby, a group of shepherds, outsiders in both senses of the word, whose lives were suddenly touched by the glory of heaven, and some kings who were not too proud to kneel in the straw and honour a baby.

The baby Jesus we see in those crib scenes didn't just change the lives of a few people in a far-away place a long time ago: Jesus still changes lives today. He still brings light and hope and challenges and courage to people all over the world, no matter what situations they find themselves in, whenever they come to recognise him not as an ornament to decorate their homes for a few weeks at Christmas but as the living God who is with us forever.

May the Christmas story come alive again for you this Christmas.

Wishing you every blessing for Christmas and the New Year.

Treasurer's Report

We give thanks once again for the commitment and support of so many people which just enabled us to balance the revenue account once again, whilst continuing to fund-raise for the Mission Possible Appeal.

Receipts & Payments

All general costs, including the £400 increase in Circuit Share, were broadly in line with the budgeted figures.

All project costs related to **Mission Possible** payments, enabling us to use normal project income towards the general revenue budget.

On the income side, Collections & Tax Recovery showed a small increase but all other income streams were down on the previous year. Rental income suffered most due to less bookings.

We are particularly grateful to those



who responded to my plea during the year and gave extra when it became obvious we were heading for a shortfall.

Summary

Thanks again to everyone for your generosity last year which just enabled us to balance the books again.

This was all the more remarkable in the light of the fact that we also raised a further £28,600 during the year towards the Mission Possible Appeal.

General Reserves at the year-end stood at £6,398 - just two months of our budgeted expenditure. This will need increasing following completion of the **Mission Possible** project to the three months budgeted expenditure figure agreed by Church Council.

Total Reserves were, of course, much higher because they include £74,553 of funds held for the Mission Possible building project.

We ask for your continuing prayerful support through the current year so that our revenue expenses continue to be covered as we concentrate our efforts on reaching our Mission Possible Appeal target.



We are delighted to report that local fundraising and donations since the inception of Mission Possible have now reached £82,450 bringing the total project amount secured to date to £300,537. Details of these figures can be found on the charts at church.

STOP PRESS NEWS: The Methodist Church Connexional (National) Property Committee has just confirmed that we will receive a superb £100,000 grant from them. This really is an answer to prayer and means that 70% of the Mission Possible budget is now covered. It also unlocks the door to other grants. We already have several other grant applications in the process of being made, with responses due next Spring. See Page 7 of this Newsletter for further information.

We are now very hopeful that we will have secured sufficient funds by Easter to enable us to commence preparatory works and confirm a start date for the contractors to come on site.
