Pastoral Letter

Dear friends,

I seem to have spent a lot of time this summer going round in circles. Going round in circles is usually a frustrating experience, but this time it was altogether different because the circles I was walking round in were labyrinths. Labyrinths look a bit like mazes, but they are very different. Whereas a maze is full of tricks and traps, a labyrinth is made up of a single path which will lead you safely into the centre and then back out again. Like our lives



and the journey of faith, the path is full of twists and turns. One moment you may find yourself walking very close to the centre and then suddenly you find yourself right back on the outside edge wondering how you got there, but wherever you are, as long as you stick with the path you will end up in the right place.

As we walk the labyrinth, we are encouraged to be open to God's presence, to let go of the things that have got us bogged down and become more open to the gifts God wants us to take with us to the world outside. In a world where we often find it hard to stop rushing around long enough to think where our lives are going, let alone pray, a labyrinth can help us to slow down, take time to look at our journey of life and faith from different angles and let God speak to us.

When we walked the labyrinth we didn't just walk alone, we had to learn to share the path with others. Sometimes we would walk side by side in parallel tracks for a while, sometimes we found someone coming towards us when we least expected it, sometimes our paths turned away from each other, sometimes we had to step aside to let someone else pass. We learned to be aware of others who were in different places on the same journey, to be considerate of each other's needs and to share our experiences, stories and questions together at the end.

Reflecting on the experiences of the labyrinth, I find myself asking two questions as we prepare for a new year in the life of the church:

What do we need to do to make more space in our lives for God this coming year?

What can we do to encourage and support fellow travellers at different stages on the journey of faith?

If you have any thoughts on the matter, please let me know!

In Psalm 25:4, the psalmist says: 'Show me your ways, O Lord, teach me your paths'. May that be our prayer this autumn.

Worship will take place in the Lounge until at least the end of the contract work, which is scheduled for completion on 2nd November.


Hall, Lounge, Kitchen and Toilets will be in use as normal whilst the work progresses but please use the Hall door as the main entrance.





The Dream is Alive!

A BIG thank you to everyone who got involved in the huge task of preparing for the contractors to come on site in July. During June, floor to ceiling screens were erected in Church & Hall and the Church was converted into a gigantic storeroom when all the rooms at the back of the building were cleared. Internal doors and partition walls were removed and cleared off site. Paving stones were laid alongside the Hall to form a temporary safe play area for Pre-School to use during the building work. Local tradesmen replaced the Hall and Kitchen fire doors and erected a fence and gate to contain the play area. Plants were dug up and potted before Keighley Tree Services cut back the bushes round the site.





























The contractors arrived on site on 16th July and, after demolishing the cabin, work started on the foundations for the new Annexe. This has taken longer than anticipated because the old cellars from the previous church had to be excavated and refilled first. The concrete was finally poured into the foundations last week. The walls will grow quite fast now. Meanwhile, work has started on the Foyer.

We are delighted to report that local fundraising and donations have now reached £89,121, bringing the total amount secured to date to £411,107. Almost 97% of the budget is now covered.

Three further grants have been received over the last few months: £25,000 from Methodist Insurance, £5,000 from the Beatrice Laing Trust and £2,500 from the Rank Foundation Pebble Grants. The £156,000 of Methodist Grants have also been paid over.

The tenders were confirmed at the end of May and preparatory building works were completed during June with support from a tremendous group of church and community members. The contractors finally arrived on site on 16th July and work on the foundations commenced. See inside for details on progress.
