Emily's passion is photography (there's a theme here!!) and she would love to make that her career. She has already signed up as Pantomime Photographer and offered to help with scenery painting.




Sharon Longman - Church Worker

Pantomime News

Our February Pantomime, Ali Baba and the Forty Thieves, had to be postponed this year due to the pandemic, so we decided to try and get our young people together once restrictions



were lifted to prepare an alternative style of Show to put on in October. The Panto Team Leaders were all keen and the children were excited at the prospect of finally being able to get some normality back in their lives. A script was prepared for a **Pantomime Extravaganza**, which brought together six mini-pantomimes using extracts from previous scripts. We managed to get enough children to cast all the roles and rehearsals were arranged. However, it then became apparent that not all the children were going to be able to commit the time needed to rehearse and prepare for a full-length Show. Catching up with missed education had to take priority and several cast members dropped out of the Extravaganza.

So, it was back to the drawing board - what should we do? Following a conversation with KYDZ: Keighley Youth Theatre, we realised that they were having the same problems with preparing for their October Concert. The obvious solution was to get together and put on a joint Show with KYDZ providing the entertainment for the First Half and the Panto Cast taking over after the Interval: a full length KYDZ & Panto Extravaganza.

The Second Half will still include scenes from Snow White and many of your favourite Panto song and dance routines, as well as other special items - as you will see from the advert opposite.

There will be up to six performances to choose from but seating capacity is being reduced and we are not selling extras on the nights. We are keeping things simple to keep everyone safe and encourage as many as possible to support our young people (details on page 12). Tickets go on sale on 1st September.

Rehearsals began after Easter in small bubble groups to comply with

Covid-19 restrictions. This has worked well and the children have been very enthusiastic - though a few

rehearsals have had to be cancelled when high numbers of children were isolating due to the virus. Everyone will be brought together in September for the final rehearsals

to get everything ready for the October Show.

We are hoping that Ali Baba will finally be able to go ahead next February! The Panto will have to be re-cast in September as we have lost some of the original cast. The script will then be finalised in October ready for rehearsals to start in November.

We look forward to your support at both Shows - bring all your family and friends - Enjoy!



Almost £3,000 has been received/promised towards the Mission Possible Appeal since March: £2,600 in donations and £321.50 from the Lees Crafty Chatters' Virtual Easter Stall. Thanks again to the Crafty Chatters for their ongoing support and for your donations, most of which covered the cost of the new organ and balustrade. Local fundraising and donations currently stand at £124,268 and the total amount secured to date has risen to £460,698.

A further £10,000 repayment has been made to the Circuit Loan, which has reduced the outstanding balance to £15,000.

We continue to make good progress with the electrical and AV upgrade work and the Lounge has been cleared ready to bring it back into use later this month. Shelving has been extended in the costume store upstairs and all the spare curtains/fabric previously stored in the loft above the lounge have been transferred to meet fire regulations.
