### Pastoral Letter

Dear friends.

During the Summer we have seen the return of many festivals, after a three year break due to the lockdowns. Over the August Bank Holiday I attended the Greenbelt Festival with much joy and relief. This very special event is my spiritual home. This was the first time we had fully gathered since the beginning of the pandemic and the gratitude was palpable. Around twelve thousand people, a truly



diverse collective, gather together in the beautiful grounds of Boughton House near Kettering for a weekend of worship and activism, comedy and poetry, politics and music.

We are now in the season of Creationtide, and the care of our natural environment is at the heart of Greenbelt. This is clearly evident in the way the camping site is left at the end of the festival. Over the weekend thousands of people camp, with field upon field a kaleidoscope of tents. The Greenbelt FaceBook page shows photographs of these fields once everyone

has packed up and gone home. These images show spotlessly clean areas of green grass without any mess, litter or discarded canvas. A stark contrast to the photos of other festival venues.

As we celebrate this Harvest season, with an emphasis upon climate justice and care for creation, may we be mindful of the imprint we are leaving on the world around us.

Frances was a very generous and caring person; she supported various charities. If you visited her, you would not leave without being given biscuits or chocolates. She enjoyed travelling and entertaining.

We are all very sad to lose her: she is missed.

Frances requested that, on her death, her jewellery was to be given to the church to be sold and any money made was for church funds.

#### **Jubilee Lunch**



#### **Treasurer's Report**

As pandemic restrictions have slowly eased during the year, church life has



#### **Receipts & Payments**

Most of the income streams were up on the previous year and hopefully that trend will continue this year.

Most Payment figures increased as well but electricity costs quadrupled due to the energy crisis. We managed to nearly double last year's Circuit Share

contribution to £13,000 - about 60% of what we normally pay. The Project Costs related to the Prayer Corner and felling the tree.

#### Summary

£400 was transferred to our General Reserves to help us weather the next 12 months, bringing them up to £2,800 (= 3.5 weeks budgeted expenditure for a normal year). Our aim is to hold three months of the budgeted expenditure figure when circumstances allow.

A further £5,000 was repaid to the **Mission Possible** Circuit Loan during the year, reducing the balance to £10,000 - to be repaid over the next two years from continued fundraising.

Our **Mission Possible** Appeal brought in a further £7,294.43 whilst payments totalled £5,908.16, leaving a balance in hand of £4,847.19 towards the next loan repayment.

The current year will be just as challenging as we face the energy crisis and other economic problems. Our activities will continue to increase at church but we ask for your prayerful support through another year as we seek to cover our revenue expenses as well as possible.

on Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> December *from 5.00 pm*Please support Ronald this Christmas



£3,045 has been added to the Mission Possible Appeal total in the last five months - from Pantomime donations, other Drama income, Family Film Evenings and other donations. Details inside.

Thanks again to everyone for your ongoing support and donations. Local fundraising and donations currently stand at £132,163 and the total amount secured to date has risen to £467,315.

We have made a further £5,000 repayment to the Circuit Loan, which has reduced the outstanding balance to £10,000.

We continue to make steady progress with the electrical and AV upgrade work which is certainly making life easier during Pantos and other productions. Our Co-op Local Community Fund balance is also growing nicely - towards replacing some of the radio microphone belt packs and headsets for our drama productions.

Your prayers continue to be valued.
